7. Narrative Description

The building at 401 W. Mississippi Drive is a one-story, glazed yellow block structure, with no particular style, built in 1931. The 1946 Sanborn map shows that the original structure was about 54 feet wide by 24 feet deep with a front section that extended from the west side of the façade south towards the river. This section has been removed, probably in the late 1950s. This portion of the façade has been filled in with glass block and a single-door entry. In the remaining portion of the façade, there is single-door entry, window filled with glass block, and a large garage door. The top of the building includes a vertically clad steel siding cornice. The front part of the roof is covered in rolled asphalt. Smaller windows on each side of the building have also been filled in with glass block. The side elevations of the original structure have been clad in vertical metal siding.

An addition has been built on the rear of the structure, probably in the late 1950s, which has doubled the depth and overall size of the structure. This addition has a pyramidal roof layered with asphalt shingles. Both sides of the building are clad in vertical metal siding, with a single-door entry on the east side of the building. The rear of the building is also clad in vertical metal siding, and it has a single-door entry.

8. Narrative Statement of Significance

The building at 401 West Mississippi Drive was built in 1931, as Ina Mae's restaurant, and remained so until 1999. Ina's Mae's was established in April 1931 by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Thayer. The café, as it was referred to then was named for Mrs. Thayer. Prior to starting the café they operated a sandwich shop for a year in a small building just east of the café. In 1936 their son George took over the business, and operated it for two years, then sold it to Alfred Curly Clark (*Muscatine Journal*, May 31, 1940, 163).

This building does not appear to be individually eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, or C. Though Ina Mae's may be somewhat locally significant, the original appearance of the building has been obscured through the removal of the front section, construction of a rear addition equal to the size of the original building, and replacement/covering of original materials with vertical metal siding and glass block. All these changes appear to have occurred in the last 50 years. Thus, it does not retain the integrity need to convey its significance as an individual structure.

However, it has traditionally operated as a 20th century commercial building on this western transportation corridor leading to downtown, and it may be a contributing structure to a downtown commercial district, depending on the final boundary. At this time, it appears that this building will fall outside the recommended boundary for the district, with vacant lots located between this building and the nearest contributing building. Additionally, the alterations to the building may be outside the period of significance for the district, and thus the building may be non-contributing to the district.



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
