
## Enlarged Images of 19 Pictures From the 1944 NHS Mirror Yearbook

The first six volumes of the Nichols High School Mirror yearbook (1944-1949) were in all aspects totally a creation of the student Mirror staff. The staff created the content, photographed the pictures, produced and printed the proofs, pasted in reserved spaces on the printed pages actual 3x5 black and white glossy prints of photographs, and bound every individual copy.

The 3x5 black and white glossy prints in the 1944 volume are an especially valuable collection. The 3x5 prints, though 73 years old, are in "like new" condition in this year 2017. And the high resolution of the glossy photo stock permits the scanning of enlarged images of the selected pictures that appear in this PDF file.

Nichols Public School Buildings in Nichols, Iowa, 1872-1944

In 1872, a new two-story wood-frame school house (inset in upper left corner) was built at the north end of the unincorporated Village of Nichols. In 1879, "attendance averages seventy-four scholars." In 1903, Bessie Baker, became the first student to graduate from the new three-year high school curriculum. In February, 1914, the wood-frame school house was destroyed by fire. Monday, November 29, 1915, was the first day of school in the new three-story brick school house erected on the east side of Nichols. A four-year high school curriculum was adopted in the 1924-25 school year. The gymnasium/auditorium was added to the northwest corner of the school house in 1934. This picture was taken during the 1943-44 school year.

## MISS MAYME FOLEY

The first NHS Mirror yearbook, as published in May 1944, was dedicated to Miss Foley for her forty years (1904 to 1944) of teaching the Intermediate Grades in Nichols Public School. She would teach an additional eight years before retiring at age 79 in May, 1952.

Miss Foley arrived in the Town of Nichols by train from Columbus Junction on August 31, 1904, to begin her teaching career at Nichols Public School, an old two-story wood-frame structure at the north end of town. For her first year she was paid \$30 per month. On page 3 of the Muscatine Journal published on May 26, 1905, is a report that the school board hired Miss Foley for a second year and increased her salary to \$40 per month.

Miss Foley's father, Andrew Foley, who had emigrated from Ireland, and her mother Mary Ann Sweeney, whose parents had emigrated from Ireland, were married in Boston on April 18, 1865. In that same year they would move to a farm home in 76 Township of Muscatine County, Iowa, where Miss Foley and her seven siblings would be born.

Miss Foley was born on January 22, 1873. She died in Muscatine, Iowa, on March 29, 1957, and was buried in Ardon Cemetery in 76 Township, Muscatine County, Iowa.




